

The Lewisburg Water and Sewer Board held its regular monthly meeting on July 21, 2020. The meeting was held at 100 Water Street, Lewisburg, Tennessee. Board members present were Chairman Bill Marsh, Secretary Joe Harris and Nicholas Tipper. Also present were General Manager Trigg Cathey, Supervisors Terry Smith, Pete Griffin, Caryl Giles, Gerald Greggs, Pat McCandless, Roscoe Brannon, and Billing Clerk Lucy Demastus.

Chairman Bill Marsh called the meeting to order at 12:00 pm.

- Item 1.** Joe Harris made a motion to approve the minutes of the June 16, 2020 meeting. The motion was seconded by Nicholas Tipper. Motion passed. Voice vote – 3 ayes
- Item 2.** June Bills and Financial Statement – Nicholas Tipper made a motion to approve the June bills and financial statement. Joe Harris seconded the motion. Motion passed. Voice vote – 3 ayes
- Item 3.** Water – Sewer Request – There were 7 residential water tap requests and 6 requests for residential sewer in the month of June.
- Item 4.** Water Plant- Reports and Memos – Water Plant Supervisor Terry Smith reported on the monthly activities of the plant. The water plant operated at an average of 18.4 hours per day. The three-month water loss average was 33.3%. The plant ran at a capacity of 79.1 % for the month of June.
- Item 5.** Wastewater Plant- Reports and Memos – Supervisor Caryl Giles reported on the monthly activities of the wastewater plant.

Wastewater employees hauled 45,400 gallons of sludge from the Cornersville WWTP to be converted into bio-solids.

Wastewater employees processed 327,775 gallons of sludge into biosolids.

Item 6. Other Business

6a. Project Update

1. Sidewalks on Mooresville Road TDOT project – This project is underway on the North side of the road. We have had to cut out an unneeded water line that was in the way of a drainage culvert. We have also had to lower one of our active water lines.
2. The waterline on War Eagle Drive behind Captain D's has been completed. The new water line is now behind for the Marshall County Health Department building. We had a huge problem with blue limestone rock and had to hire an explosive team to get the ditch dug. We can now provide water to the dialysis clinic from two directions.
3. A new set of water valves for the water plant have arrived and are being stored in the water plant, this project will be done in a week of bad weather.
4. We are about to replace an old broken concrete sewer line that runs through the land that was once McCord school. This should reduce inflow of rainwater and eliminate sewer backups on that line.
5. Our crews successfully made the 10-inch water tap to service the Minth company's new facility. They plan to use 291,000 gallons of water per day. We plan to have them sign an agreement so they pay for the water whether they use it or not.
6. We have begun the design process on a new booster pump station across from Allison Transmissions. This station will be above the ground and have twice the capacity of the old one. The revenue from Minth will pay for the station.

6b. Revision to construction policy #12 – pumped sewer – Joe Harris made a motion to approve the revision to construction policy #12. The motion was seconded by Nicholas Tipper. Motion passed – voice vote – 3 ayes.
